

Recognising different types of text

What is text?

Text is any piece of writing. It could be a letter, an email, a novel, a poem, a recipe, a note, instructions for D.I.Y, an article in a newspaper or magazine, writing on a webpage or an advert.

All of these examples can be called **texts**.

When you're reading or writing any text think about the purpose of the text or why it has been written.

What might the purpose of a text be?

- An advert might try to persuade you to buy something.
- A letter from school might inform you about something.
- A novel might **describe** somewhere or someone to you.
- A car manual might **instruct** you how to do something to your car.

Depending on the **purpose** of the text, different writing methods will be used to get the message across to the reader.
